Would you want to be an Anglo Saxon / Viking? Yes / No? Why

Describe the difference between invaders and settlers.

Create a selection of Anglo Saxon artefacts, being resourceful by using recycled materials such as a crown from cereal box.

Draw a plan view sketch of an Anglo Saxon village with a perimeter wall. What would be inside the walls and why? Be creative and decorate your book!

Key Vocabulary

Create a glossary or words that you have used across all of the different learning tasks.

Remember: A glossary is a list of words in alphabetical order with definitions.



<u>Art</u>

· Explore famous sketch artists from different periods?

Try to create a selection of sketches across all of our subjects using whatever media you have at home, pencils, felts, crayons, paints. You could for example use Leonardo Da Vinci as a famous artist and use his style of sketches.



Science

Using our digestive system theme try to sketch out a digestive system remembering to label all the parts.

Find some simple / common food chains such as Plant - insect - animal.

Then try to think of some more complex chains, noting where they all begin? Think about what has happened in our class experiment, can you draw sketches? Explain in words or maybe tell a story?

<u>Maths</u>

Alongside the maths, pack workbook we are learning to estimate using measures, including mm, cm, Metres, grams, Kilogrammes, Litres, Millilitres and money. We will be calculating different measures, including money in pounds and pence. I have included 3 maths tasks on money, these could be spread over a week after playing with money, maybe set up a small shop with price tags and a shopping list total also there are many online money games.

We will also be learning to read, write and convert time between analogue and digital 12 and 24-hour clocks. We will look at solving problems involving converting from hours to minutes; minutes to seconds; years to months; weeks to days.
