- Take photos of the different plants you see. Try to get a clear picture of the leaves and any flowers on each plant. Make a page in your learning journal to show what you found on your nature walk.
- If you haven't done it already, plant the seeds that you took home before Easter. Keep a diary to record how the seed changes. Take measurements of the plant's height with a ruler.
