Activity 1 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Read the end of chapter 3 of the Skellig extract-how different was your conversation to the one Michael and Skellig actually had? What first impressions do you get of Skellig? What evidence within the text is there for your reasons? 	
Activity 2 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Read the next chapter 4 of the book (attached as a word doc!) Look through the ‘Biscuit Blunder’ statements and decide whether they are true-‘custard cream’, false-‘jammy dodger’ or there is no evidence in the text ‘biscuit blunder’. Remember to use PEE strategy- Point, Evidence, Explain-to give detail about your choices! 	
Activity 3 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Write a detailed description of a ‘junk’ room in your house such as garage, cellar or loft/attic! Think about creating an atmosphere through your vocabulary choices! You could even make ‘an unusual discovery’. Remember your personal writing targets! Plus all those nagging targets! 	
Activity 4 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Read chapter 5 and identify all the contracted words in that chapter, either highlight or write them down-what two words have been contracted in order to make the one word! Remember a contracted word is one that is made up from two words that uses an apostrophe to show the omitted letter or letters e.g. I’ve = I have
