

## **Dual Duty Words: Nouns and Verbs**

Some words can function as **nouns** and **verbs**. Look at the two examples and decide whether the word underlined is a noun or a verb.

- Please light the fire.
- Grandma switched on the light.

Highlight the **underlined verbs in yellow** and the **underlined nouns in pink** in the following sentences.

### **paints**

- Banksy paints his designs on public buildings.
- The paints need to be put away after use.

### **sigh**

- At the end of the film I let out a huge sigh.
- We sigh when we are sad or frustrated.

### **play**

- The school play will begin at 6:30 pm.
- If you play well, you might make the team.

### **drops**

- Rain drops noisily all over the rooftops.
- Drops of water tumbled on to the patio.

### **dust**

- The dust was so thick you could draw in it.
- Every Wednesday I dust the ornaments on the mantelpiece.

### **poison**

- Some spiders can poison you.
- The false widow spider's fangs inject poison into its victim's flesh.

### **drain**

- All the bathwater was emptied down the drains.
- If you have a shock, the colour drains from your face.

### **spread**

- She spread the butter thickly on each slice of toast.
- There was an enormous spread on the kitchen table.
