- Go on a shape hunt. When you're out and about can you look for: Circles, Squares, Triangles and Rectangles. Let us know what you see.

Art and Music

- Hide a teddy bear and challenge others in your family to find it.
- <u>Draw the wind</u> use a pencil and imagine the wind is blowing across the page can you make some marks that look like the wind blowing? Change the marks to show strong wind or a gentle breeze.

Literacy

 Look at the word mat – can you use the pictures to help you work out what the word below might be? Do you recognise any of the words?

- Sound out the initial sounds of the words and use the mat to play a game of eye spy.
