Parts Of A Plant (Activity 1) – With an adult, read through the information on plants. Discuss and verbally answer the onscreen questions. (You do not need to print out or write up your answers for this task, just discuss them).

Did You Know Facts (Activity 3) – Use the question prompts and website suggestions, to do some research and come up with two ‘Did You Know’ facts about plants.

Task: Think of a special place which you enjoy spending time in. Draw a picture of your special place and around the outside brainstorm your feelings when thinking about your special place.
