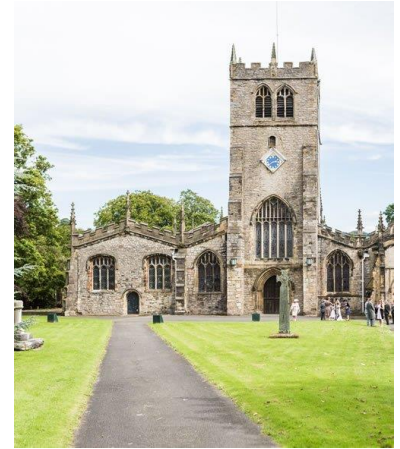
Places of worship are very important for religious followers:

Christian places of worship.

Many Christians emphasise that the 'Church' is really the community of Christian believers, who are called the 'body' of Christ. Buildings are places to allow Christians to gather together to worship, and to give them a place from which to serve the community.



Protestant places of worship.

Some newer Protestant church groups use simpler type of buildings, such as school halls. Protestants have no statues or sacred images, they have simple architecture, replacing altars by a 'communion table' around which the organisation is centred.



Muslim places of worship.



The Holy Qur'an says that "The world, the whole of it, is a Mosque [a place of prayer] Wherever you turn, there is the face of God. " 2: 115. The mosque itself reveals some key Muslim beliefs, such as the idea of ummah or community, submission, and the Oneness of God.
