

Fronted Adverbials

LO: I can use Fronted Adverbials

- A fronted adverbial goes at the beginning of a sentence
- It describes the verb in the sentence
- It describes where, when and how

Example 1:

As soon as he could, Tom jumped off the train.

- The text in red shows when Tom jumped off the train.

Example 2:

Gently, she lifted the sleeping baby.

- The text in blue shows how the baby was lifted up.

Example 3:

At the park, I lost my coat.

The text in green shows where the coat was lost.
