Monday	P.S.H.E.	<p>The Balanced Plate</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Copy the "Food Groups" chart labelled 'PSHE – Food Groups' from the website and sort the function and foods into the correct groups. • Design your own "Balanced" Pizza including foods from as many of the food groups as you can. • Label your toppings and state which food group each of your pizza toppings belong. Is your pizza balanced? • What do we mean when we say "One of your five-a-day?"
	German	<p>Numbers</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Using the link and password provided log on to Linguascope Elementary. • Select the German Flag (trallalla). • Select Zahlen (1 – 31) • Play Spiel Nr 2 (Game Number 2): Easy Version: This is a listening/ Memory Game: match 2 numbers correctly, then move onto Difficult. • Play Spiel Nr 3 (Game Number 3): Easy Version: This is a maths and German game! Do the sum and find the correct German number word, then if you are confident move on to the difficult version. • You can repeat the earlier games if you are not confident to move on or would like more practise.
Tuesday	P.E.	<p>Shuttle Run challenge</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • At home if you have enough space outside measure 10 big steps and mark out the run. (roughly 8-10m in length) • You can use anything to mark out the steps for example use pebbles or mark a line with chalk.



		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • When you have measured out your 10 big steps practice running from out side to the other. • Challenge - Once you have had a few practice goes see how many times you can complete the shuttle run without stopping or without walking. • You could also try this challenge on your bike or scooter? • Again make a note of how many you can do and share your results on Seesaw. <p style="text-align: center;">Mr Harris' Weekly Challenge</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Don't forget to have a go at Mr Harris' video weekly challenge this week – This will be uploaded onto Seesaw.
	Music	<p style="text-align: center;">Learn to Sing the song – The Dragon Song</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Using the link and password provided log on to Charanga Yumu using the Student Log-in (The middle one). • Scroll Down to Year 3. • Click on the green box named 'Songs for ages 7 to 9'. • Launch Scheme Songs. • Scroll down the list on the right side and bypass 13 songs until you see “Learn to Sing the song – The Dragon Song” and click this one. • Click Step 1 and practise Verse 1, Verse 2 and the chorus. • If you become confident with the words perhaps you could practise with the backing track only! • Enjoy!
