

Wednesday	Geography	<p><i>Mountains</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In the Zoom call at 1:20pm we will work through the UK Mountains Presentation from the website as an introduction to today's task. You task for today is to imagine that you recently went on a climbing holiday to one of Britain's mountain ranges and create a presentation, poster or description about your holiday. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Research the mountain range that you have chosen Record your findings in notes. There is a sheet called Geography – Mountain Research to give you ideas for the information you could collect. When you have completed your research present your recount of your holiday in any way you wish.
Thursday	R.E.	<p><i>What does it mean to be a Hindu?</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> This week's R.E. task requires you to use all of learning that you have completed about Hinduism this half term. Our key question for our R.E. learning this term is 'What does it mean to be a Hindu?' <ul style="list-style-type: none"> I would like you to create an answer to this question in any way you choose. You can create a presentation, a poster or a piece of writing, the choice is yours. I look forward to seeing the work you create on Seesaw.
Friday	Science	<p><i>Rocks & Fossils:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In the Zoom session at 1:20pm we will go through the 'Science – Rocks & Fossils Quiz' to find out about different types of soils and to see how much you have learnt during this topic. On the school website open the resource 'Science – Rocks & Fossils Crossword'. This interactive pdf document lets you complete the crossword onscreen. Read the clues and type the answers into the crossword. If you need it, you can use the word bank on the second page which has all the possible answers. This might be useful to check the spellings of the words. As an extra challenge you can complete Activity 2, which is on the last page of the pdf document. Read about the stages of fossilisation. Can you fill in the gaps by choosing the correct word from the drop-down boxes?
