Act It Out Adverbs

- A <u>verb</u> is a doing word e.g. He <u>spoke</u>.
- An <u>adverb</u> tells you how, where or when something is done e.g. He spoke <u>gently</u>.
- Notice how the adverb changes the meaning of the sentence e.g. He spoke <u>angrily</u>.
