Grammar: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Fronted Adverbials- Write 10 sentences based on Skellig choosing two fronted adverbials from each heading on the ideas sheet, check your punctuation carefully. https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/articles/z63ny9q Watch the video, play the games and complete the worksheet based on use of synonyms and antonyms. 	
Activity 1 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Read up to chapter 31. Write 8 Alan Peat style <i>'Emotion word comma'</i> sentences based on what you have read in the text. E.g. Traumatised, Michael's parents returned from hospital after visiting their sick child. 	
Activity 2 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Read through the sections of play script. Write down how the text is different to the novel you are reading. Watch the PowerPoint of how to write a play script and make a note of how the Skellig play should be improved. Make the changes to the script. Choose a section of the story so far and rewrite it as a play script-remember to use all the features as the PowerPoint explains-structure it correctly in your book-at least 1 side of A4. 	
Activity 3 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Read the novel up to the start of chapter 34-where there is a split 10 lined poem made up of 5 rhyming couplets. See the attached sheet with poem on. Check the meaning of any unfamiliar words so you fully understand it. Write your own 8- 10 line poem based on the character of Skellig-it must follow the rhyming couplet pattern-do not over complicate it-simple is better!
